They will be in the **foyer**, **bar** and **inside the theatre.**


They will be happy to **help** if you need **assistance.**

There are accessible toilets on every floor of the building.

There is a **bar** on the **ground floor** of the theatre.




There will be announcements over the speakers saying when the show will start.

ABOUT THE PLAY

Bad Lads is a new play, written by Mike Kenny, created from a story by Jimmy Coffey and the other Medomsley boys.

Medomsley was a detention centre for young men who had been caught breaking the law.

While they were there, these boys were abused and harmed by the adults who were meant to be taking care of them.

This play has been created from the real life stories of young men who were sent to Medomsley.

Bad Lads calls for justice for these men.



This is Older Jackie.






This is **Signing Jackie.**



When Jackie was 17 years old, he stole a milk van with his friends.




Jackie was caught by the police and was arrested.

at him.




Puppet hit Jackie because he did not call him Sir.


Jackie was hurt.



Jackie was scared because he had never been away from home before.




The next morning,

The boys had to work hard at chores in the freezing cold.




Onslow hit Jackie when he was cleaning the floor and Jackie was hurt again.

Jackie was very frightened.


He worried about what might happen each day in the kitchen.

house.




Jackie was sexually abused by Husband many times.

Jackie **felt different** now.




Jackie became very unhappy.

He got **married** and had a **family.**




Jackie could never forget the horrible experiences he had at Medomsley.

Jackie decided he had to talk about what happened.


The police interviewed Jackie and many of the other boys who went to Medomsley.



All of the boys had terrible stories to tell about how they were treated so badly there.



Jackie went to court and told the story of what happened to him.



Seven of the Medomsley guards, including Husband were found guilty of abuse and went to prison.




None of the guards admitted that they hurt the boys at Medomsley, even though they were found guilty.
